

#### <u>Fruit</u>

Fruit exhibits to be displayed with stems attached, with the exception of citrus fruits stems which are to be cut close to the surface of the rind leaving green plump sepals.

#### **Vegetables**

A sample cut may be necessary for judging purposes, with the exception of pumpkins.

#### Honey Products

A standard 500g jar filled to 5ml from the rim with a white lid is required for the Honey Classes. Honey Exhibits will be judged against the standard point scales applying to various honey products, that is flavour, density, colour, aroma, and cleanliness.

into 2 or 3 pieces	½ teaspoon ground ginger
250g (8oz) currants	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel	250g (8oz) butter
90g (3oz) red glace cherries chopped	250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
into 4 to 6 pieces	½ teaspoon lemon essence <b>OR</b>
90g (3oz) blanched almonds chopped	finely grated lemon rind
cross-wise into 3 or 4 pieces	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	½ teaspoon vanilla essence
	4 large eggs

#### Method:

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
- Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices.
- Cream, together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition.
- Alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures and mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ – 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin
