#### Eggs

Do not wash eggs as this removes their natural bloom, gently brush to clean. Display in a clean undamaged carton.

#### Fruit

Fruit exhibits to be displayed with stems attached, with the exception of citrus fruits stems which are to be cut close to the surface of the rind leaving green plump sepals.

#### Vegetables

A sample cut may be necessary for judging purposes, with the exception of pumpkins.

# **Honey Products**

A standard 500g jar filled to 5ml from the rim with a white lid is required for the Honey Classes. Honey Exhibits will be judged against the standard point scales applying to various honey products, that is flavour, density, colour, aroma, and cleanliness.

Judges are looking for what is typical of the flower or plant, free from disease, insect or other damage, clean and **fresh.** Judges may, at their discretion, award 1<sup>st</sup> and/or 2<sup>nd</sup>, and/or make Highly Commended Awards. Judges also have the discretion to make no prize or award in a Class if, in their opinion, there is no exhibit in that Class worthy of a prize or award.

All plant material must have been grown by the exhibitor. All plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 90 days prior to show. Please label exhibits. This is important as the purpose of a Show is education as well as competition and other exhibitors and the public may be interested in growing varieties that have been exhibited. If unknown, write on exhibit tag 'Name Wanted Please' and there may be someone who can assist you in naming that exhibit. For pots both the scientific name and common name is desired. In the Bonsai Classes, the age of the Exhibit should be included with the name.

There are bottles provided (soft drink bottles); however, you may use a container of your own choice. This container **must** be of clear glass for the cut flower classes. Specimen flowers must have their own stem and foliage. No stems longer than 70cm please. Pack the stem in the bottle neck using kitchen towel or oasis so that the stem is held firm for judging and display purposes.

Foliage plants are judged on the quality and appearance of leaves and stems. Flowering plants are judged for their display of flowers but should not show obvious foliage damage. Do not put oil on leaves of plants, leaves should be cleaned of all dirt but not coated in anything.

- 1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
- a) Garment: an item that can be worn e.g. dress, jacket, scarf, hat

- 3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- 6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- 10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- 11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.

#### **Class 20 - RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION**

- Prize money is sponsored by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW (ASC). Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$20.00 and will be required to bake a second 'Rich Fruit Cake' in order to compete in a Group Semi Final to be conducted in December.
- The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$30, and are required to bake a third 'Rich Fruit Cake' for the final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.

Note: Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.

Attention Judges: All Fruit cakes are to be cut in half when being judged.

## The following recipe is compulsory for all entries in the Rich Dried Fruit Cake Competition

Ingredients:

250g (8oz) sultanas

250g (8oz) raisins snipped

into 2 or 3 pieces 250g (8oz) currants

125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel

90g (3oz) red glace cherries chopped

into 4 to 6 pieces

90g (3oz) blanched almonds chopped

cross-wise into 3 or 4 pieces

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g (8oz) plain flour

60g (2oz) self raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

½ teaspoon ground ginger

½ teaspoon ground cloves

250g (8oz) butter

250g (8oz) soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR

finely grated lemon rind

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs

#### Method:

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
- Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices.
- Cream, together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition.
- Alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures and mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20 cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately  $3\frac{1}{2} 4$  hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin
