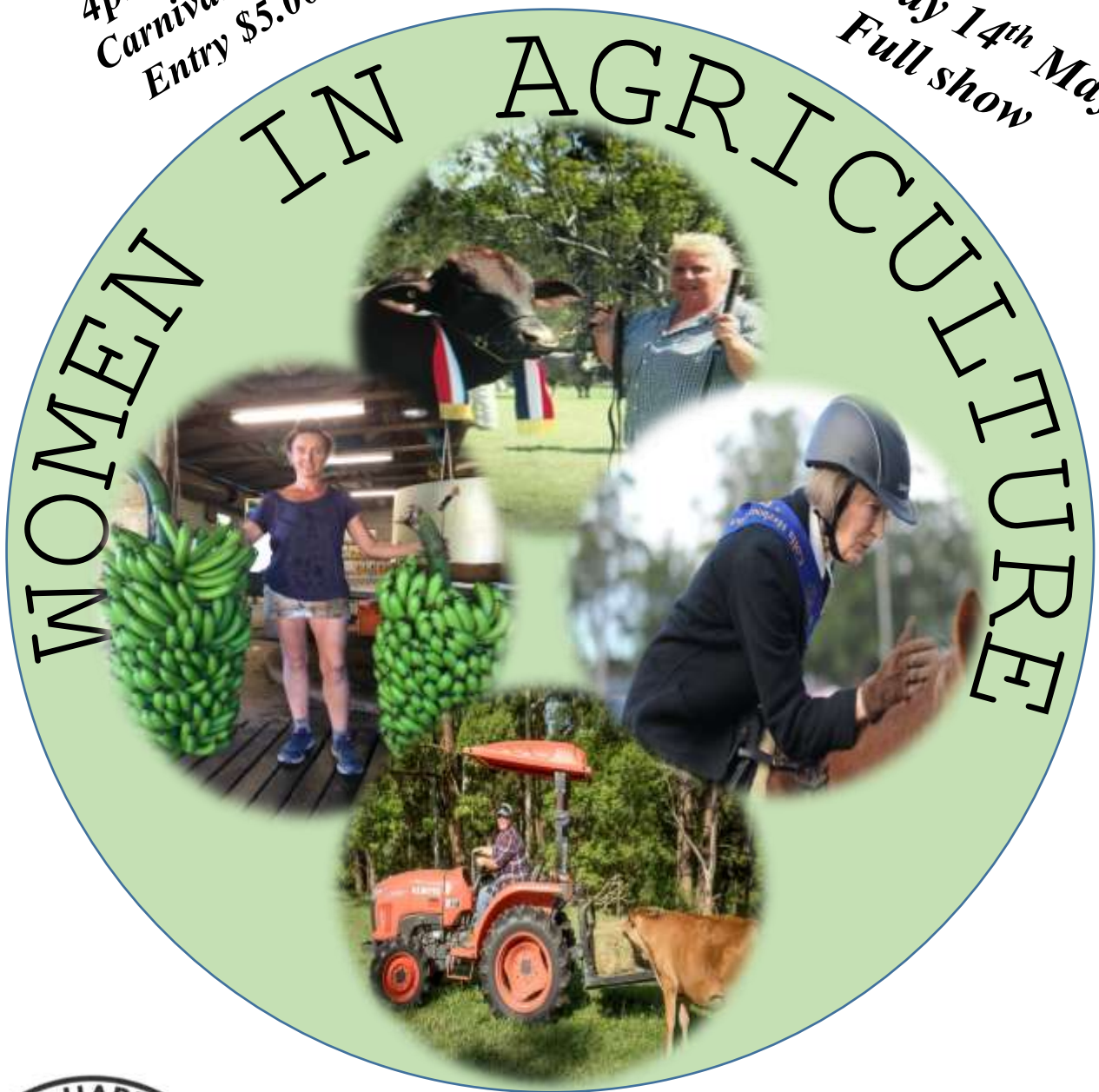

PRIZE MONEY: Please see each section; Prize money will only be awarded to 1st prize if 3 or more exhibits are entered in that class. Prize money will only be paid to 2nd prize if 4 or more exhibits are entered in that class.

Prize money may be collected on Sunday 14th May 11am -1pm or 4.30pm to 5.00pm in the Exhibition Hall and Monday 15th May from 9am -11am from the Secretary's Office
Prize money and exhibits not collected by 11am Tuesday 15th May 2017 will be forfeited.

STEWARDS: Members of the Coffs Harbour Garden Club

ENTRY FEE: \$2.00

PRIZE: 1st \$6.00, 2nd \$3.00, unless otherwise stated

RIBBONS: to 2nd place

Prize money will only be awarded to 1st place if 3 or more exhibits are entered in that class. Prize money will only be paid to 2nd place if 4 or more exhibits are entered in that class.

Judges are looking for what is typical of the flower or plant, free from disease, insect or other damage, clean and **fresh**. Judges may, at their discretion, award 1st and/or 2nd, and/or make Highly Commended Awards. Judges also have the discretion to make no prize or award in a Class if, in their opinion, there is no exhibit in that Class worthy of a prize or award.

All plant material must have been grown by the exhibitor. All plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 90 days prior to show. Please label exhibits. This is important as the purpose of a Show is education as well as competition and other exhibitors and the public may be interested in growing varieties that have been exhibited. If unknown, write on exhibit tag 'Name Wanted Please' and there may be someone who can assist you in naming that exhibit. For pots both the scientific name and common name is desired. In the Bonsai Classes, the age of the Exhibit should be included with the name.

There are bottles provided (soft drink bottles); however, you may use a container of your own choice. This container **must** be of clear glass for the cut flower classes. Specimen flowers must have their own stem and foliage. No stems longer than 70cm please. Pack the stem in the bottle neck using kitchen towel or oasis so that the stem is held firm for judging and display purposes.

Foliage plants are judged on the quality and appearance of leaves and stems. Flowering plants are judged for their display of flowers but should not show obvious foliage damage. Do not put oil on leaves of plants, leaves should be cleaned of all dirt but not coated in anything.

SECTION 14 FLOWERS & PLANTS

Decorative

Exhibits are judged on interpretation of schedule, creativity, originality, principles and elements of design. Plant material should predominate over all components in a design. Entries must be the exhibitors own work.

All Classes in Decorative have a **maximum bench space allowance of 40cm** unless otherwise indicated. Fresh plant material need not necessarily be grown by Exhibitor in Decorative. All floral material must be 'fresh' in water or water storage medium or be self-sufficient plant material (e.g. cacti, succulent, fruit or vegetables) unless otherwise indicated.

Class

- 32** Arrangement for a Special Occasion with the occasion named.
- 33** Arrangement in a basket or kitchen container – Must use fresh plant material but embellishments may be used. Maximum bench space allowed 50cm square.
- 34** Arrangement of flowers and foliage, **flowers one colour** only.
- 35** Foliage Manipulation'
- 36** Flowers with fruit and/or vegetables
- 37** 'A Petite Arrangement'. Scale is the most important principal. All material (including container) must be in the same proportion. More than 10cm but less than 25cm overall.
- 38 Professional Florists Competition**
An arrangement of fresh flowers and plant materials, for Mother's Day. Your finished design may include embellishments but is to be predominantly horticultural Materials. Bench space allowed 850mm square on black.

- Judges decisions will be final
