

#### **Eggs**

Do not wash eggs as this removes their natural bloom, gently brush to clean. Display in a clean undamaged carton.

#### Fruit


Fruit exhibits to be displayed with stems attached, with the exception of citrus fruits stems which are to be cut close to the surface of the rind leaving green plump sepals.

#### Vegetables

A sample cut may be necessary for judging purposes, with the exception of pumpkins.

#### **Honey Products**

A standard 500g jar filled to 5ml from the rim with a white lid is required for the Honey Classes. Honey Exhibits will be judged against the standard point scales applying to various honey products, that is flavour, density, colour, aroma, and cleanliness.



- Well risen, thin golden crust top and bottom, no flour base.
- Fine, moist texture, good crumb.
- Preferably cut with a cutter [scone, biscuit] and not a knife.
- Judges decisions will be final
